The Graham Coupland Lecture and Medal

G.A.E. Coupland (1934-1982), had a distinguished, but short, career as a gastric and paediatric surgeon. Coupland graduated in medicine from the University of Sydney in 1959 and obtained his Master of Surgery from the same institution in 1975. He was a brilliant and natural surgeon, especially of the upper gastrointestinal tract. He later turned his attention to the surgery of children.

As Supervisor of Surgery for the University of Sydney, he was an admired and respected teacher at Royal North Shore Hospital. In 1976 he was appointed associate professor. He also taught at the Singapore General Hospital under the Colombo Plan. He was an energetic and enthusiastic member of the New South Wales Regional Committee from 1978 to 1982.

A/Prof. Laurencia Villalba is the Head of the Vascular Surgery Department for ISLHD, Clinical Lead and Founder of the Venous Thromboembolism service and Founder of the Vascular Care Centre in Wollongong.

She was the first supervisor of training for Vascular Surgery in Wollongong and the first female member of the Court of Examiners for Vascular Surgery.

Angus is a paediatric orthopaedic spine surgeon with an interest in education. He was a RACS Examiner in Orthopaedics for 9 years and Senior Examiner in 2020 to 2022. The Pandemic created myriad problems which were successfully navigated by the Court of Examiners and their teams.

A/Prof Margaret Schnitzler

Margaret Schnitzler was the first female colorectal surgeon appointed in Australia when she commenced practice in 1996.

She is currently Associate Professor in Surgery, University of Sydney, co-Deputy Head of Sydney Medical School and Head of the Northern Clinical School. Margaret has clinical appointments at RNSH and North Shore Private Hospital.

Dr Raffi Qasabian

Dr Raffi Qasabian is a vascular and kidney transplant surgeon in Sydney with an outreach program in regional NSW and Armenia. He has been Chairman of the RACS NSW State Committee. Raffi is a keen teacher, is currently an examiner in vascular surgery and has commenced PhD studies.
